| Now back to the rivalry! How might these words be used in a letter of advice? | Let's have students talk to each other in their pairs about advice and practice using their words. For example, one partner might say, "There are a lot of advantages to getting along well with your brother. You can share a reptile or gang up on your parents and do a lot of slurping at the dinner table!" Once they have practiced giving each other advice, each student will write his or her own advice letter to either Fudgie or to Peter. |
